



Shoreline and Bank Stabilization Project Permitting Flow Chart

DEFINITIONS

JARPA (Joint Aquatic Resource Permit Application), Complete **DRAFT** A common application needed for many / most shoreline, wetland and other critical area projects.

SITE PLANS: Site plans are an aerial and a side view drawing of your project design based on examples found in the Pend Oreille County Shoreline Stabilization Guide techniques section. Plans can be drawn by you - the landowner, by a consultant, or by a professional engineer. Contact POC or POCD for information on available site plan / design resources.

PLANTING PLAN: A planting plan details the type, quantity and location of native trees, grasses and shrubs to be implemented as part of your project's mitigation requirements.

SEPA (State Environmental Policy Act) Checklist, Complete **DRAFT** State and local agencies use this checklist to help determine whether the environmental impacts of your proposal are significant.

START

Contact the Pend Oreille County Community Development Staff to determine permitting path and establish expectations.

IF NEEDED, site visit with Landowner, POCD Staff, County Staff (+Other agencies if required) to provide an overview of the process and available resources. A project plan is developed from there.

Applicant submits JARPA and SEPA permit applications to POC Community Development Staff.

If a project is on the Pend Oreille River, POC Community Development may instruct the landowner to mail a copy of these applications to the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers.

Once completed permit applications are submitted to POC Community Development, *processing can take between 45 and 90 days* depending on project complexity.

POC Community Development informs landowner of permit approval.

Once approved, landowner may begin on construction of the SITE and PLANTING plans using the construction window cited in approved permit applications.

FINISH
